1.0 Purpose

The purpose of this paper is to request approval from Board of Management (BOM) for the project on Holistic Strategy for Sustainable Workforce Including Foreign Workers.

2.0 Background

There are 2.059 million legal Foreign Workers (FW) in Malaysia, and these numbers not included the illegal FW who also found working in various sectors. Industries have recognised the efforts made by the government to solve shortages of workforce in selected industries through FW but the dependency on FW is still there. This is because some companies do not want to go for automation as it is easy to get cheap FWs. Thus the current practice may lead to low productivity due to cheap FWs. Besides, less attractive offers made by the companies could be one of the reason local workers are less interested to work for them. In addition, according to Business Chambers, some Malaysian workers are not reliable like they don't turn up for work when the companies needed them most, especially after getting month end pay and bonus time.

Therefore there is a need for establishment of holistic strategy for a sustainable workforce including foreign workers. PEMUDAH has endorsed MPC for the establishment of the Technical Working Group (TWG) on 18 June 2019 and the TWG to conduct the necessary review, prior to implementation as well as provide the recommendations to the PEMUDAH on Foreign Workers.

3.0 Objective
