1.0 Purpose

The purpose of this paper is to request for Board of Management (BOM) to approve budget for Reducing Unnecessary Regulatory burden (RURB) on Private Residential Aged Care facilities in Malaysia

2.0 Background

- 2.1. Better governance at the national and sectoral level accelerates productivity performance. One of the productivity areas for improvement is to address regulatory challenges, which requires implementation of clear and effective regulations across ministries, agencies, industry players, across the nation.
- 2.2. In the private healthcare subsector, there were issues raised by business and World Bank on the challenges faced in the licensing process, requirements and standards that imposed by multiple regulatory agencies of the private residential aged care facilities.
- 2.3. According to World Bank, 2020 is the year where Malaysia is already an aging society (7% of the population are 65 years old above) and no longer a young developing country. The composition of older persons is increasing. This accounts for about 80,000 to 100,000 increase/new cases a year. This is one primary reason of the high number of unlicensed private residential aged care facilities in Malaysia.
- 2.4. To start with the project, PHPN will gather the information and feedback from the Operators, Developers, Local Councils as well as Ministry of Health on the issues and challenges that they are facing in order to regulate the Private Residential Aged Care facilities in Malaysia
